Behavior: The young adult years can be some of the most challenging as your pet matures and becomes socialized. Consult with your vet about behavior issues such as mouthing, jumping, barking... what you do now can determine the type of relationship you and others have with your pet. Correcting issues early can help you bond with your pet.
